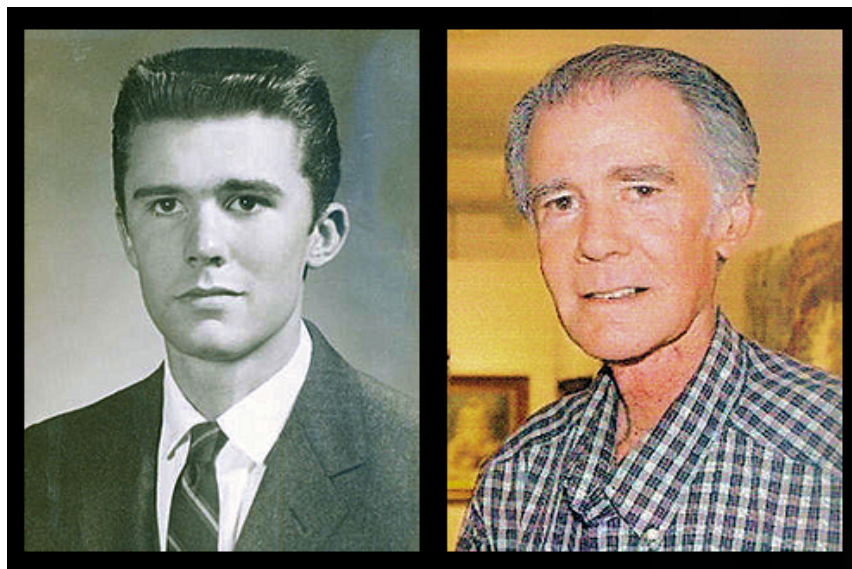


In Memory Of Charles McWhorter

Charles Stakely McWhorter Sr, 72, of Waco passed away peacefully at home on November 26, 2014.
