Case closed. I stopped taking it and no issues. Every single one of my ER Visits for concussion was caused by this drug."

Rik Spencer is one of our "pastor" graduates. He calls himself an Air Force Brat but how in the world could a potential pastor ever be a brat as a child coming into age! After reading Rik's story, it made me realize how much of the world he has visited, lived, and experienced. One thing for sure: Rik knows his final destination— which hopefully is a long, long time from now. Pastors are human and enjoy life....most especially GOLF and A&M. So, get yourself a cup of coffee and sit back and take some travels with Rik. Thank you so much, Rik, for sharing with us. Now, here is his story in his own words:

"I moved to Waco in the summer of 1958 & spent my junior & senior years at W.H.S. My freshman year was in Wiesbaden, Germany, & my sophomore year in Victoria, TX – just 1 of the many vagaries of being an Air Force brat – 3 high schools in 4 years! So getting to have my last 2 years in the same high school was a real treat. After graduating, I spent the summer memorizing how to properly say, "I don't know," to an upperclassman at A&M, along with lots of other Aggie minutiae that a Fish had to know. I never studied that hard for a Miss Dumont chemistry test!

When we lived in Waco, I attended Lakewood Christian Church & was very active in the H.S. Youth Group. I became really good buddies with 3 guys – Bill Wrench (Lubbock), Sid Slaughter (Mayfield, KY) & Bob Stephenson (Pflugerville). We get together once a year for a week to play golf, eat great food, tell lies, do that touristy thing & have a good old time. It's a special time. We're all still married to our 1st wives, &,

amazingly, they all became best buds on their 1st meeting! We usually get together somewhere in Arkansas or Missouri, since it's kind of in the middle of where we all live.

My college career wasn't much different from high school – 3 semesters at A&M, 1 year at the U. of Maryland in Ramstein, Ger., 1 semester at Indiana University (an interesting story about how this happened), & returned to A&M in January of '64. I graduated in '65 – English major, history minor & 1 class short of a German minor. After graduation, I left TX for Indiana, where I'd met the love of my life, Julia (who goes by Judy).

Didn't come back to TX for 20 years, when we took our son on a college campus tour – 6 schools (S.M.U, T.C.U., Baylor, T.U., A&M & Trinity).

Judy & I were married on October 23, 1965, & I got my draft notice on October 26th. Since the Air Force only wanted pilots for Viet Nam, I couldn't enlist & go through O.C.S., because I'm blind as a bat. So I enlisted in the Kentucky Army National Guard & served honorably for 6 years. I say with great pride that no foreign power was able to invade the Commonwealth of Kentucky during my service!

Our only son, Craig, was born on July 28, 1969. He lives near us & is on the Kroger management team. Our only granddaughter, Olivia, was born on June 17, 2002, & she lives with her mother in Indianapolis. Craig has very generous visitation rights, & we get to spend a lot of time with Olivia. She has grown into a beautiful young woman, & she's a joyful presence in our lives.

My day jobs have been many & varied.
